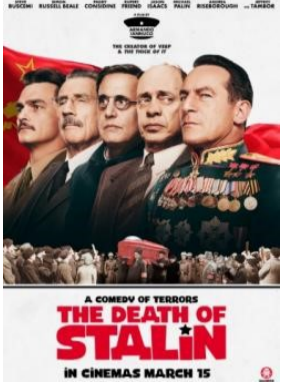

A Fantastic Woman (104mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Violence, offensive language, sex scenes

The Oscar winning tale of a transgender woman mourning her lost lover. Marina (Daniela Vega) is headstrong, vivacious and confident. After her partner dies suddenly, she is met with suspicion and prejudice by his family. Marina boldly steps forward to expose the banality of intolerance and prove that she is, indeed, a fantastic woman.



The Death Of Stalin (107mins) R16 Restricted: Violence, sexual references, offensive language

When Joseph Stalin drops dead, his cronies square off in a frantic power struggle to be the next Soviet leader. Among the contenders are the dweeby Malenkov (Jeffrey Tambor), the wily Nikita Khrushchev (Steve Buscemi), and the sadistic secret police chief Beria (Simon Russell Beale).

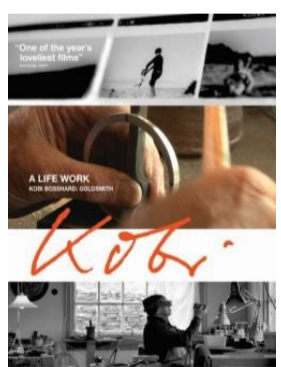
The Guernsey Literary & Potato Peel Pie Society (123mins) **NEW**

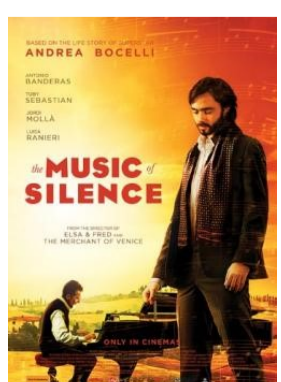
Kobi (106mins) E Exempt from rating **FINAL**

A bold new interpretation of the biblical story. Set in the Holy Land in the first century C.E., Mary Magdalene (Rooney Mara) leaves her small fishing village and traditional family behind to join a radical new social movement. At its head is a charismatic leader, Jesus of Nazareth (Joaquin Phoenix), who promises that the world is changing.



The Music Of Silence (115mins) PG Parental Guidance Recommended

THE MUSIC OF SILENCE tells singer Andrea Bocelli's story through his alter ego, Amos Bardi. Born with the gift of a beautiful voice, an illness leaves Amos almost blind. Learning braille at an institute, an accident causes him to completely lose his sight. Despite everything, Amos refuses to give up.
