**Funny Cow (103mins)**

FUNNY COW charts the rise of a female comedienne (Maxine Peake) through the 1970's and 1980's industrial Northern England. From her violent childhood to her turbulent adult relationships, she uses the raw material of her life experiences to bring comedy to the stage.
