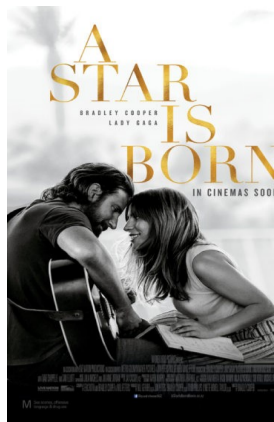

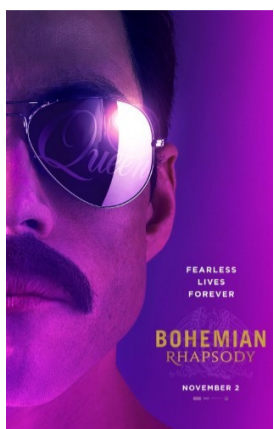

**A Star Is Born** (136mins)

M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Sex scenes, offensive language, drug use

In this new take on the tragic love story, seasoned musician Jackson Maine (Bradley Cooper) discovers—and falls in love with—struggling artist Ally (Lady Gaga). Ally has just about given up on her dream to make it big as a singer – until Jack coaxes her into the spotlight.

**Bohemian Rhapsody** (134mins)

Offensive language, sexual references, drug references

BOHEMIAN RHAPSODY is a foot-stomping celebration of Queen, their music and their extraordinary lead singer Freddie Mercury (Rami Malek), who defied stereotypes and shattered convention to become one of the most beloved entertainers on the planet. The film traces the meteoric rise of the band and their near-implosion as Mercury's lifestyle spirals out of control.

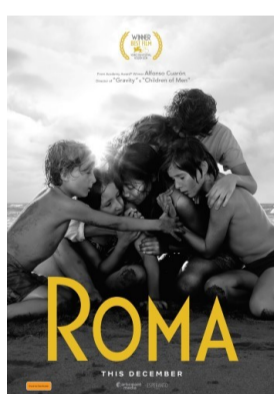

**Old Man & The Gun** (94mins)

THE OLD MAN & THE GUN is a beautifully crafted film inspired by the true story of career robber Forrest Tucker (Robert Redford). Following a prison escape at the age of 70, Forrest embarks on a string of bank robberies that confound the authorities and enchant the public. Wrapped up in the pursuit are detective John Hunt (Casey Affleck) and love interest Jewel (Sissy Spacek).

**Roma** (134mins) **subtitled**

ROMA is Alfonso Cuarón's intimate, gut-wrenching and ultimately life-affirming portrait of the ways one family maintains its balance in a time of personal, social and political strife. It follows a young domestic worker Cleo (Yalitza Aparicio) from Mixteco heritage descent and her co-worker Adela (Nancy García), who work for a small family in the middle-class neighbourhood of Roma.

**Stray** (104mins)

Suitable for Mature Audiences: Adult themes

Jack (Kieran Charnock), a young man on parole for grievous bodily harm, holes up in a cabin somewhere in Central Otago. Locked away in a prison of his own making, Jack one evening encounters Grace (Arta Dobroshi), very far from home and seeking refuge.
