The Aftermath (108mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Violence, offensive language, sex scenes **FINAL**

Germany, 1946. Rachael Morgan (Keira Knightley) arrives in the ruins of Hamburg to be reunited with her husband (Jason Clarke), a British colonel. As they set off for their new home, Rachael discovers that they will be sharing the house with its previous owner, a German widower (Alexander Skarsgård). In this charged atmosphere, enmity and grief give way to passion and betrayal.



All Is True (101mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language, sexual references

Devastated after the loss of his renowned Globe Theatre, William Shakespeare (Kenneth Branagh) returns to Stratford, where he must face a troubled past and a neglected family. Haunted by the death of his son Hamnet, he struggles to mend the broken relationships with his wife (Judi Dench) and daughters. His very personal search for the truth uncovers secrets and lies within a family at war. Directed by Kenneth Branagh.



The Chaperone (108mins) PG Parental Guidance recommended: Coarse language

THE CHAPERONE takes place against the backdrop of the tumultuous times of the early 1920's. A Kansas woman (Elizabeth McGovern) is forever changed when she chaperones 15-year-old dancer Louise Brooks (Haley Lu Richardson) to New York for the summer. One of them is eager to fulfill her destiny of dance and movie stardom; the other is on a mission to unearth the mysteries of her past.



The Hummingbird Project (111mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language **NEW**

Cousins Vincent (Jesse Eisenberg) and Anton (Alexander Skarsgård) are players in the high-stakes game of High Frequency Trading. Their dream? To build a fibre-optic cable in a straight line between Kansas and New Jersey, making them millions. Breathing down their necks is their old boss Eva Torres (Salma Hayek), a sociopathic trader who will stop at nothing to see them fail.
