CAMINO SKIES is a walking meditation on life, love and loss. Exploring themes of spirituality, wellbeing and religion, this is the inspirational journey of six strangers from New Zealand and Australia walking the 800km Camino de Santiago to overcome the personal and physical trauma that life has dealt them. Through blisters, shin splints and heat, the Camino forces pilgrims to defy their age and physical ability, while also acting as a catalyst for change.




Pavarotti (114mins) E Exempt from rating

PAVAROTTI is a riveting film that lifts the curtain on the icon who brought opera to the people. Director Ron Howard puts audiences front row center for an exploration of The voice, the man, the legend. Luciano Pavarotti gave his life to music and a voice to the world. This cinematic event features history-making performances and intimate interviews, including never-before-seen footage.



Rocketman *(121mins)* M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Sex scenes, offensive language, drug use ROCKETMAN is an epic musical fantasy about the story of Elton John's breakthrough years. The film follows the fantastical journey of transformation from shy piano prodigy Reginald Dwight into international superstar Elton John (Taron Egerton). This inspirational story tells the universally relatable story of how a small-town boy became one of the most iconic figures in pop culture.



Wild Rose (100mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Sex scenes, offensive language Rose-Lynn Harlan (Jessie Buckley), 23, is bursting with raw talent, charisma and cheek. She is also fresh out of jail and has two young kids to support. All she wants to do is get out of Glasgow and make it as a country singer. Her mother (Julie Walters) wants her to settle down and take

responsibility for herself, but when a chance encounter brings Rose-Lynn closer to her dreams of Nashville, she faces a choice between family and stardom.



Yesterday (115mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language, sexual references, drug references

Jack (Himesh Patel) is a struggling singer-songwriter whose dreams of fame are rapidly fading, despite the fierce support of his best friend Ellie (Lily James). Then, after a freak accident during a mysterious global blackout, Jack wakes up to discover that The Beatles have never existed. Performing songs by the greatest band in history to a world that has never heard them, Jack's

fame explodes. But as his star rises, he risks losing Ellie.
