

Exhibition On Screen: Degas (91mins) E Exempt from rating NEW

This documentary journeys from the streets of Paris to a superb exhibition at the Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge. With exclusive access to view rare and diverse works, this film tells a fascinating story of Degas' pursuit for perfection through both experimentation with new techniques and lessons learnt from studying the past masters.



The Keeper (119mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Violence, offensive language

THE KEEPER tells the true love story between young English woman Margaret Friar (Freya Mavor) and German PoW Bert Trautmann (David Kross). Meeting at the end of WW2 in a PoW camp, Margaret's father notices Bert's prowess as a goal-keeper and gets him to play for his team. Rather than going back to Germany, Bert marries Margaret and signs for Man City.




Late Night (102mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language, sexual references

Katherine Newbury (Emma Thompson) is a legendary late-night talk-show host. When she's accused of being a "woman who hates women", she hires Molly Patel (Mindy Kaling) as the first female on her writing staff. But Molly might be too little too late, as the formidable Katherine also faces the reality of low ratings and a network that wants to replace her with a younger male host.



Once Upon A Time In Hollywood (141mins) R16 Graphic violence, drug use, offensive language, sexual material Quentin Tarantino's ONCE UPON A TIME IN HOLLYWOOD visits 1969 Los Angeles, where everything is changing, as TV star Rick Dalton (Leonardo DiCaprio) and his long time stunt double Cliff Booth (Brad Pitt) make their way around an industry they hardly recognize anymore. A tribute to the final moments of Hollywood's golden age.



Pavarotti (114mins) E Exempt from rating

PAVAROTTI is a riveting film that lifts the curtain on the icon who brought opera to the people. Director Ron Howard puts audiences front row center for an exploration of The voice, the man, the legend. This cinematic event features history-making performances and intimate interviews, including never-before-seen footage.



Yesterday (115mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language, sexual references, drug references **FINAL**Jack (Himesh Patel) is a struggling singer-songwriter whose dreams of fame are rapidly fading, despite the fierce support of his best friend Ellie (Lily James). Then, after a freak accident, Jack wakes up to discover that The Beatles have never existed. Performing songs by the greatest band in history to a world that has never heard them, Jack's fame explodes.
