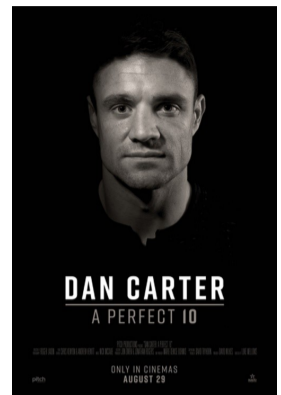

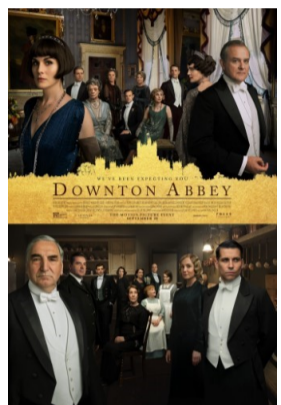
Dan Carter: A Perfect 10 (91mins)

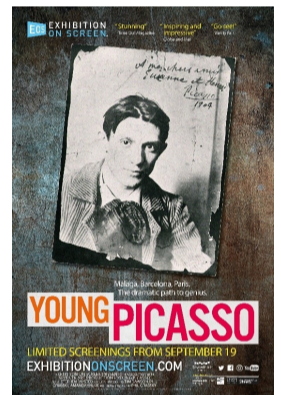


Downton Abbey (122mins)
