Art On Screen: Tintoretto (96 mins) Partly subtitled E Exempt from rating

TINTORETTO – A REBEL IN VENICE tells the story of painter Jacopo Robusti, known as Tintoretto, from the early years of his artistic career until his death in 1594 in the city that inspired and challenged him. A one of a kind genius, he reflected the true spirit of the lagoon city.



Baby Done (91 mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language, sexual references, drug use **NEW** When Zoe (Rose Matafeo) and Tim (Matthew Lewis) find out they are having a baby, they resolve to not let parenthood change them. Terrified that her life won't be her own anymore, Zoe is determined to tick off a list of their wildest dreams before the baby arrives.



Hope Gap (100 mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language, suicide references **FINAL** Grace (Annette Bening) and Edward (Bill Nighy), married for 29 years, live in a small seaside town. When their son Jamie (Josh O'Connor) comes to visit for the weekend, Edward informs him that he plans to leave Grace that same day.

The story of teenage climate activist Greta Thunberg is told through compelling, neverbefore-seen footage. Starting with her one-person school strike for climate action outside the Swedish Parliament, we follow Greta in her rise to prominence.




The Mystery Of Henri Pick (101 mins) Subtitled M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language Elia An editor discovers a novel she deems a masterpiece in a library collecting manuscripts refused by the publishers. The text is signed Henri Pick, a Breton pizza maker who died two years earlier. With its twists and turns, this film is a puzzle that captivates and excites.



Romantic Road (81 mins) PG Parental Guidance recommended: Coarse language, drug references
Rupert and Jan Grey are a free-spirited upper-class English couple in their sixties. Not content to retire, they ignore everyone's advice and embark on a remarkable journey – to drive their 1936 Rolls Royce across India on their way to Dhaka, Bangladesh.



The More You Ignore Me (99 mins) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Sex scenes, offensive language Based on the novel by Jo Brand, this is a darkly funny story of dysfunctional family life in 1980's England. Gina's efforts to be a loving mother and wife are undermined by her declining mental health, while her daughter Alice struggles to relate to her mum.



Three Tenors (87 mins) Partly subtitled G Suitable for General Audiences **NEW**It's been 30 years since Luciano Pavarotti, José Carreras and Plácido Domingo made their debut as The Three Tenors on the eve of the 1990 Football World Cup Final. With neverbefore-seen backstage footage, this documentary offers fascinating insights.
