The Artist's Wife *(95 mins)* M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Nudity, offensive language, sexual content Claire (Lena Olin) is the wife of celebrated artist Richard Smythson (Bruce Dern). Once a promising painter herself, Claire now lives in the shadow of her husband's career. When he is diagnosed with dementia, she shields his condition from the art community.



Days Of The Bagnold Summer *(86 mins)* M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Offensive language Funny, charming and wince-inducingly accurate, this British comedy sweetly draws you into the wobbly relationship between well-intentioned single librarian Sue Bagnold and her black-clad teenage son Daniel, who is stuck with Mum for the summer holidays.




Dream Horse *(113 mins)* PG Parental Guidance recommended: Coarse language, sexual references The inspiring true story of Dream Alliance, an unlikely racehorse bred by small town bartender Jan Vokes (Toni Collette). With little money and no experience, Jan convinces her neighbours to chip in to help raise Dream and compete with the racing elites.



Herself (*98 mins*) M Suitable for Mature Audiences: Domestic violence, offensive language Sandra (Clare Dunne) is a young mum struggling to provide her two daughters with a warm, safe home. When it becomes clear that the Dublin council won't provide that home, she decides to build it herself from scratch. With little income and no savings, Sandra must use all her ingenuity to make her ambitious dream a reality.



In The Heights *(143 mins)* PG Parental Guidance recommended: Coarse language **NEW** IN THE HEIGHTS is a vibrant and joyous musical celebrating the neighbourhood of Washington Heights, NYC. Usnavi is a bodega owner who looks after the aging Cuban lady next door, pines for the girl next door and dreams of escaping to his native Dominican Republic. From the creator of hit musical *Hamilton*.



99-year-old Isey lives with her adult son James on their small farm in Kawakawa. Isey is turning 100 in a week. In their unique relationship, James has devoted the last 20 years to looking after his mum. A joyous celebration of the sacred and everyday aroha.
