It's 1957, and ex-racecar driver Enzo Ferrari (Adam Driver) is in crisis. Bankruptcy stalks the company he and his wife, Laura (Penelope Cruz), built from nothing, while their marriage struggles with the loss of their son. Ferrari decides to counter his losses by rolling the dice on one race – 1,000 miles across Italy, the iconic Mille Miglia.

Poor Things (141 mins) R18 Restricted: Body horror, sex scenes, nudity, offensive language NEW Bella Baxter (Emma Stone) is a young woman brought back to life by the brilliant and unorthodox scientist Dr. Godwin Baxter (Willem Dafoe). Hungry for the worldliness she is lacking, she runs off on a whirlwind adventure across the continents. Free from the prejudices of her times, Bella grows steadfast in her quest for liberation.
