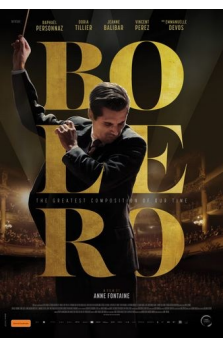

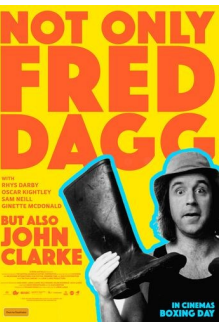

**PG** Parental Guidance recommended: Mild themes ***FINAL***

Paris in the Roaring Twenties. When choreographer Ida Rubinstein chooses Maurice Ravel to compose the music for her next ballet, the composer will give birth to his greatest success ever: the Boléro.



**Not Only Fred Dagg** *(107 mins)*

When satirist John Clarke died in 2017, the world mourned an icon. In a remarkable series of recorded conversations, John and his daughter (writer/director Lorin Clarke) offer delightful insights into his four decades in the entertainment industry.



**Nuremberg** *(148 mins)*

**M** Mature Audience: Holocaust imagery, suicide

Germany at the end of WWII. While the Allies have the task of ensuring the Nazi regime answers for the horrors of the Holocaust, a US psychiatrist (Rami Malek) is locked in a psychological duel with Reichsmarschall Herman Göring (Russell Crowe).



**Prime Minister** *(102 mins)*

Going behind the scenes of Jacinda Ardern's administration and private life, we follow her for seven years as she is catapulted to the top of New Zealand politics.



**Song Sung Blue** *(132 mins)*

Based on a true story, two down-on-their-luck musicians (Hugh Jackman and Kate Hudson) form a joyous Neil Diamond tribute band, proving it's never too late to find love and follow your dreams.



**What Lies Between** *(85 mins)*

A writer, Jim (Daniel Betty), rents a cottage on remote New Zealand farmland. As he explores the surrounding forest it becomes evident that he is not alone. When he encounters a stranger (Ruth Strong), Jim begins to grow suspicious of her intentions.



**Wicked: For Good** *(137 mins)*

The final chapter of WICKED begins with Elphaba (Cynthia Erivo) and Glinda (Ariana Grande) estranged. As Glinda prepares to marry Prince Fiyero (Jonathan Bailey), she attempts to broker a conciliation between Elphaba and The Wizard (Jeff Goldblum).
