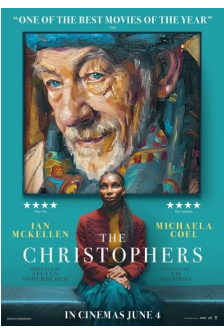

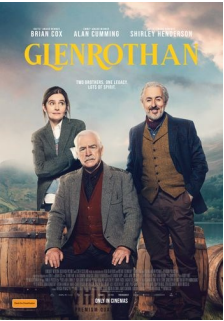

M Mature Audience: Offensive language ***FINAL***

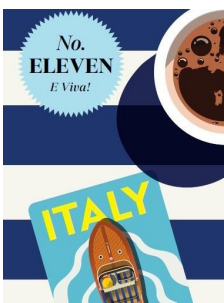

M Mature Audience: Violence, offensive language, content may disturb

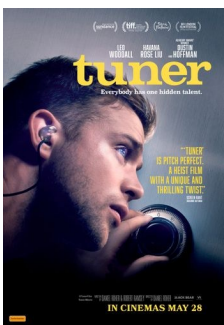
